Are Your Recycle and Compost Containers Used by Residents in Your Building?

If your recycle or compost bins or carts are not being filled in your building, it is time to step up efforts to engage residents to keep food scraps, food-soiled paper and plant debris out of the trash.

Since January 1, 2022, new State law SB 1383 requires all California residents to separate these compostable and recyclable materials from the trash. When compostable material breaks down in landfills, they produce methane, a potent greenhouse gas and contributor to climate change. You help fight climate change by making it easy for your resident to compost and recycle. Spring Cleaning Recycling Tips for Your Household

Plastic Shopping Bag



- ☒ Recycle
- ☒ Compost
- ☒ Trash

Flimsy plastic is not recyclable. Place in the trash or take back to the store if accepted. Never bag recyclables or compostables.

Napkins / Paper Towels



- ☒ Recycle
- ☒ Compost
- ☒ Trash

Food-soiled or wet paper, along with food scraps belong in the compost container, and not in the recycle or trash container.

Food & Beverage Cans



- ☒ Recycle

Metal and aluminum cans should be clean and dry before placing them into the recycle container.

Diapers & Pet Waste



- ☒ Recycle
